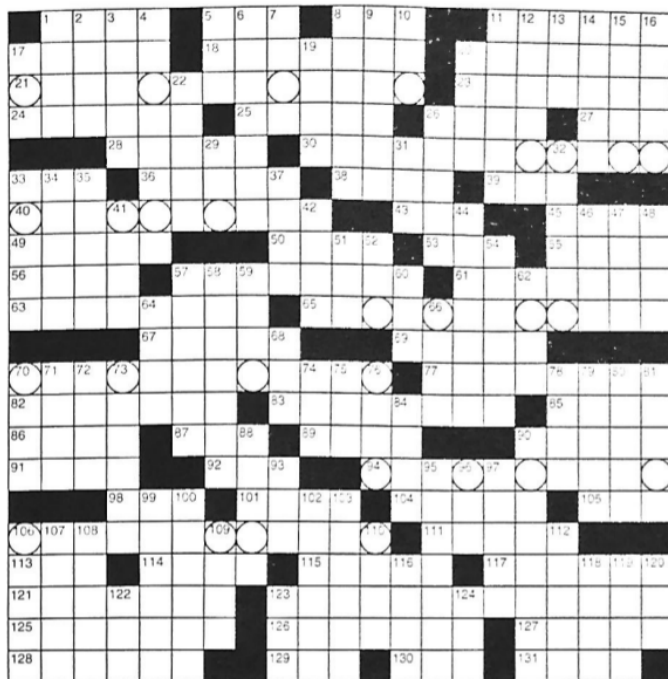

121-Across: Often compared to Sherlock Holmes, the unlikely sleuth ARSENE Lupin appears in 17 novels and 39 novellas by French writer Maurice Leblanc (1864-1941). Leblanc paired Lupin and Holmes in a 1906 short story, but Arthur Conan Doyle, Sherlock's creator, objected to the unauthorized use of the name. From then on, Lupin collaborated with (and outsmarted) sleuths named Herlock Sholmes and Holmlock Shears.
